Dr. Edwina Hoffman was honored Friday, March 29, 2005 by Sunshine State TESOL, the flagship English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) organization in Florida.

Edwina is an instructional supervisor with Miami-Dade County Public Schools’ Office of Adult/Vocational, Alternative and Community Education.

She currently supervises the Skills for Academic, Vocational and English Studies (SAVES) program, an adult refugee program funded by the Office of Refugee Services under the Department of Children and Families.

A graduate in Oriental and African History from Middlebury College (Vt.), Dr. Hoffman did her graduate work in English for Speakers of Other Languages and Curriculum and Instruction at Florida International University.

She taught for five years in Venezuela, then for six and half years with the Miccosukee Tribe of Indians, and for ten years with the State University System before joining Miami-Dade County Public Schools.
